OUTREACH BIBLE STUDY


Might you be available to help – even by just attending an outreach-style Bible study for seekers? Please let Jonathan know – it would probably be at 2pm on a Monday.

WORLD FOCUS

EGYPT

For decades Christians faced severe legal and bureaucratic barriers to building or repairing places of worship. A 2016 Law helped to redress this imbalance by granting licenses to 3,453 church buildings out of 3,730 that applied. Tens of thousands of churches still await legal recognition. Even legally recognised churches face restrictions whist mosques don't. That creates a sense of marginalisation, subtly affirming the belief that Christians are second-class citizens in their own homeland. Christian converts from Islam face ostracization and violent threats, even death. Legally, a convert cannot officially amend their religious affiliation. Christians face persistent social and economic marginalisation in both private and public institutions, including access to quality health-care, education and employment opportunities.

Christian widows and single mothers are highly vulnerable to exploitation or abuse. In recent years, Christians have endured waves of violence, firebombing of churches, homes and businesses torched over unfounded accusations. In many cases, perpetrators walk free. "Reconciliation sessions" are sometimes convened in lieu of legal action, where Christian victims are pressured to forgive instead of justice being served.

Pray:- That the church will continue to grow and be strengthened and that the Lord will care for the marginalised, the poor, the hungry and the persecuted, because we ask it in His holy Name.
